### LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Services and Housing In the Province operates on lands which are part of the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit. In particular we acknowledge the territory of the Anishinabek, Huron-Wendat, Haudenosaunee, Neutral and Ojibway / Chippewa peoples; the land that is home to the Metis; and most recently, the territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation who are direct descendants of the Mississaugas of the Credit. 

SHIP's latest housing initiative, the establishment of new supportive housing at 236 First St. in Orangeville, represents an essential step in addressing homelessness and supporting vulnerable individuals throughout Dufferin County. By offering permanent independent housing and on-site supports and services for 27 individuals and families, the project aims to empower tenants with stability and autonomy, fostering a stronger, more inclusive community. The building prioritizes safety and focuses on recovery, enhancing tenants' overall well-being while equipping them with essential resources for personal growth, recovery and success.

Beyond its immediate impact in Orangeville, this initiative serves as a model of compassion and effectiveness for neighboring regions, demonstrating SHIP's dedication to housing excellence and promoting sustainable social well-being across the area.

This achievement would not have been possible without the support of the Town of Orangeville, Dufferin County, and the Ministry of Health, alongside dedicated community stakeholders demonstrating a collaborative effort and a shared commitment to addressing homelessness and promoting well-being, to Dufferin County's most vulnerable individuals.



# UNIVERSITY AVENUE TRANSITIONAL PROGRAM

SHIP, in partnership with the Region of Waterloo, began operating the University Avenue Transitional Program earlier this year. Working together, we co-designed a renovation plan that is transforming University Avenue's physical space, aligning it with SHIP's vision of quality housing and safe spaces for 80 individuals. A key part of the initial work was to develop trust and rapport

with residents to minimize disruption during the transition period to a new programming model. Trust was built with an emphasis on resiliency, accountability and fostering relationships with key community partners.

University Avenue has brought more than 30 new staff to our organization who have demonstrated, through their day to day work, a level of excellence and commitment to the community. We remain focused on community engagement and development as we continue to expand our presence in the Region of Waterloo.

# **SUPPORTIVE HOUSING**

SHIP's Supportive Housing Teams are committed to excellence by leveraging evidence-based practices like the Housing First model to achieve our goal to produce better client health and housing outcomes. This past year the Supportive Housing team took part in an international Housing First Fidelity Review in support of our journey to enhance service and housing excellence. Fidelity reviews serve as a mechanism of adherence to evidence-based practices. Since adopting a Housing First approach many years ago, SHIP has completed ongoing evaluations on our progress to increase fidelity and hold ourselves to a standard of excellence.



Our Supportive Housing Fidelity Team met virtually with a Housing First team in Ireland and over several months, both teams engaged in interviews, documentation reviews and focus groups to review each program across the key domains of Housing and Services that meet client needs using a Recovery Oriented Approach, Separation of Housing and Supports and overall Program Operations.

The review found that SHIP is reaching a high level of Housing First fidelity and the Ireland Team provided helpful recommendations for quality improvements.

SHIP is very committed to increasing the standard of excellence across the community-based supportive housing sector. We have presented on our involvement in this work at national conferences in Canada and the U.S. and are working with the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness on creating a model for peer reviews and enhancing the fidelity review model.
